The establishment of postal services in a nation, is an index of progressive culture

Savage nations do not feel the need for communication

During the Ottoman rule there was not any regular postal service available for private use

Greeks were using "random opportunities" through travelers and sail near ships

Hellenic Postal Service established in 1829 during the war of Independence against the Ottomans The first steps were made on the ruins left by the destruction of the 10 years long war

The expansion of the Hellenic postal Service was rapid

The number of the post offices increased from the initial 13 in 1829, to 92 in 1861

Besides those Hellenic Postal Service operated 8 post offices abroad
in order to serve the Greek populations still remained under Ottoman occupation.

The prephilatelic period ended on October 31st, 1861 when the first stamps of LHH circulated



Synopsis

The purpose of this exhibit is to show the establishment and the development of the Hellenic Postal Service

After the fall of Constantinople, Greek diaspora never gave up the idea of reunite and evolve in an new independent country

Greeks were always using some type of postal service, even under the Ottoman rule, that became the basis for establishing the Hellenic Postal Service

Notetable that the Hellenic Postal Service established during the war for independence, on the ruins and the destruction of the war.

The total population of Greece in 1828 was about 750,000 p. as much as Paris alone Villages population ranged from several decades to few thousand people Even the Athens population, when liberated in 1833, was no more than 3,000 p. In 1861, after 30 years, the total population of Greece increased to 1,100,000 p.
